What Makes St. Michael's So Special?

- St. Michael's has been serving the Flushing community since **1851** (172 years in September).
- Faith, morals, and discipline are instilled in our students with the teachings of the Catholic faith.
- St. Michael's welcomes children of all faiths and races. We are inclusive with 70% of our student non-Catholic.





Curriculum

- St. Michael's Catholic Academy follows the same curriculum as all public schools in New York City and New York State. This curriculum is based on the Next Generation Standards.
- The curriculum includes a Dual Language Immersion Program with English and Mandarin as the target languages.
- Both languages are taught daily to kindergarten students.
- Physical Education, Art, Music, Library, and Technology are included in their weekly schedule.







What Is The Language Program? Why Should Students Learn Another Language?

- Learning another language **increases** the child's brain functioning (cognition).
- For those who speak Mandarin, they will be proficient in both their native language, and a second language, English.
- For those who do not speak Mandarin, they will learn a second (maybe a third) language.
- Academic performance is **stronger** in a bilingual student. Research shows that bilingual students **outperform** monolingual students by **up to 20%** in State Assessments.





Kindergarten Schedule Arrival: 7:45am - Dismissal: 2:45pm

- 50% or one half of the instructional time is in English. 50% or one half of the instructional time is in Mandarin, **for all students**.
- The Mandarin lessons are developed with the English curriculum. It is more intense than the introduction in Preschool. Writing, speaking, listening skills are developed.
- In Kindergarten, there is more of a need for conforming and being able to transition to various activities.
- Snack time is provided mid morning for all students.
- Free breakfast and lunch is also available for students in all grades.





How Do We Measure Your Child's Growth?

- In English, the <u>iReady</u> assessments are given. Instructional support materials are then assigned to the students based on their levels. Our reading series also offers us testing tools to evaluate the students. <u>HMH</u> provides additional reading readiness materials.
- The <u>Level Learning Assessment Diagnostic</u> is used to measure the growth in the Mandarin language.



Help For The Families

- Financial Aid applications are released usually in January (2024). You will need the W2 and 1040 completed for 2023; Food Stamps, Social Security, or proofs of other yearly income or assistance. Financial Aid applications have a **non-refundable fee** payable to the scholarship program by credit or debit card.
- 85% of our families receive help with the tuition from the scholarship programs in the Diocese of Brooklyn.
- 5% discount off 2024-2025 tuition for early registration. Deadline May 1, 2024, <u>no exceptions</u>.
- **\$775.00 credit** for referring another student. The referred student must attend the entire 2024-2025 school year. The credit will be added to your tuition bill by May, 2025.
